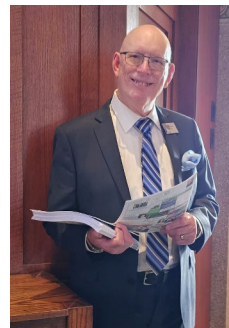

Members must be registered parishioners for at least 18 months, have a history of consistently supporting the parish through the Sunday offering, be committed to the

work of the Church, be part of the worshipping community, have an active spiritual life and have a bachelor's degree or equivalent business experience. Desired areas of professional expertise include finance, accounting, business administration, commercial real estate, commercial property management, fund-raising, and law.

The Pastoral Council is a group of St. Anne parishioners who advise the pastor on matters affecting the spiritual and material well-being of our community. The council is comprised of the pastor, his parochial vicars and 11 lay members representing all aspects of the parish. The lay men and women are chosen by discernment to serve for up to three years. Through members' interaction with fellow parishioners and involvement with church ministries and activities, the Pastoral Council serves as a voice for the St. Anne Catholic Community. The council meets once each month.

This support often takes the form of sacramental preparation, formal classes, scripture studies, prayer groups, and opportunities for fellowship and growth as a community.

Adult Confirmation

Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA)

Interested in joining the Catholic Church? The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is for adults interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and discerning preparation for full sacramental initiation into the Catholic Church. This process is open to unbaptized persons, those baptized in another Christian denomination, or baptized Catholics in need of First Communion, Reconciliation, and Confirmation. OCIA will meet on Sunday afternoons, 3:00-5:00 p.m. from Sept. - May.

Baptism of Children/ Parental Preparation

Classes to prepare parents and godparents for the Sacrament of Baptism are completed online at www.saintanne.org and are taught by the Augustine Institute. Please contact us to schedule the Baptism or for questions about preparation or reception of the Sacrament.

Children 7 years and older receive the Sacrament of Baptism through a process called OCIA for Children. This process consists of two years of formation through Continuing Catholic Education classes (CCE) along with additional sacramental catechesis in the second year. Those in OCIA for Children will receive all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) as well as be prepared to make their first Reconciliation.

Children's Religious Education

Our CCE (Continuing Catholic Education) classes for children PK4-6th Grade meet on Sundays from 10:10am-10:55am during the school year. Families wishing to enroll their children must be registered members of St. Anne Catholic Community.



First Communion & First Reconciliation Preparation

Sacramental preparation for First Communion and First Reconciliation is a one-year process (usually in the second grade), but requires a year of CCE before enrollment. Families wishing to enroll their children must be registered members of St. Anne Catholic Community and will be required to provide a new copy of their child's baptismal certificate.

ROOTED (Grades 7 and 8)

Rooted is the first part of St. Anne Youth Ministry. All middle school students are encouraged to join this program as the next step in their religious education, which enables participants to form their faith in a safe, judgement free, youth-friendly environment. Lessons and activities

are age appropriate and created to strengthen the faith of young people and help them grow as Disciples of Christ. Rooted meets on Sunday afternoons, 3:30-4:55 p.m.

CHOSEN (Youth Confirmation Preparation)

The process of preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation is a 2-year journey that may begin in 9th grade. Preparation will include Catechetical and community-building classes, as well as service oriented classes. We have weekly sessions at St. Anne (Sundays, 3:15-4:45 p.m.), service opportunities, and an annual, onsite retreat. Our Confirmation ministry is designed to help teens know the love of Jesus and prepare to live as Disciples of Christ in the world.

Youth Ministry (Grades 7-12)

Ministry for our teens, where through interaction and instruction, we will raise the future leaders of our Church. Youth Ministry involves Catechesis, Evangelization, Service, Community, Leadership Development, and Prayer. Events include, Brave the Wilderness Summer Camp, Archdiocesan Youth Conference and Rally, Service Projects, and our weekly scripture study – Word on Wednesday or WOW. To grow this ministry we need teens looking to get involved in their parish and faith life, and adults willing to share and help them.

The St. Anne's Guild is a women's organization open to all women registered in the parish. Our purpose: to serve God through service to our parish and the local community. Altar Society –

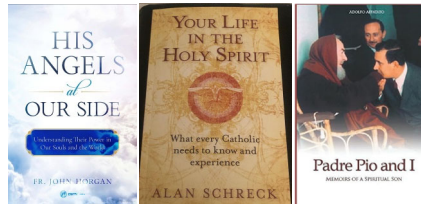

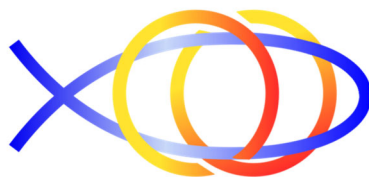

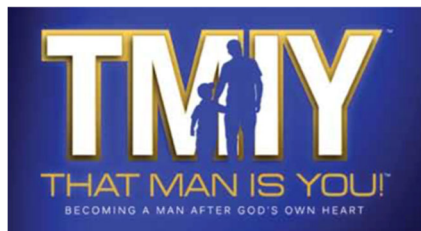
